5.1 Proposal sent to EBR Registry to support rural residents with wells for water testing due to proposed windfarm construction North Kent 1 windfarm. So far about 100 residents have requested well testing. We did not object to the proposal, only that residents' wishes to have their wells tested prior to construction should be honoured by the MOECC and most recent scientific data on vibration impacting ground water needs to be considered.

APPROVED AT WATCH ANNUAL MEETING as amended APRIL 12, 2016 EBR posting Air Reg.419 for Benzene and flaring

WATCH specifically wishes to emphasize support and the importance of the following proposal requirements for transparency and impacts on public health:

- 1. Annual ambient monitoring reports, including a summary of actions to address any statistically significant higher monitoring results, must be posted on the facility website;
- 2. Tracking of complaints available for public review;
- 3. A requirement for "no backsliding" of existing air pollution controls at the facility not specified in the proposed technical standard;
- 4. The monitoring data on the facility public web-site must be accessible, updated and maintained to understand continual improvement opportunities and trending results over many years per facility;

- 5. The data sharing should not be exclusive to the web-site. The facility should also use other venues such as newsletters to neighbours and community advisory panels to promote the access to this information; and
- 6. We expect both industry and all MOECC departments to work collaboratively to address best practice modelling and risk assessments of unplanned upsets, specifically for high risk operations and worst case scenarios relating to but not limited to sulphur and benzene flaring. There should be a requirement that these risk assessments (specifically for flare recovery/pressure relief technologies) are embedded, documented and monitored in a company's Process Safety and Inherent Safety procedures. If a company chooses to use another modelling program not prescribed by the guidance document, it must publically disclose that modelling process, prior to approval.
- 7. MOECC apply standards used in other jurisdictions, such as province of Alberta, *Non-Routine Flaring Management: Modelling Guidance*.

We support:

"These implementation efforts are anticipated to culminate in a review of the petroleum refining and petrochemical sector requirements in 2023."

However, we are concerned that there is no mechanism within the government

- 1. to trigger a review
- 2. to audit the government's promptness in completing the review
- 3. to report the findings of the review and performance to the public In addition, for the monitoring and reporting data, we respectfully request that these items become standard inclusion in the Environmental Commissioner of Ontario's Annual Report.
